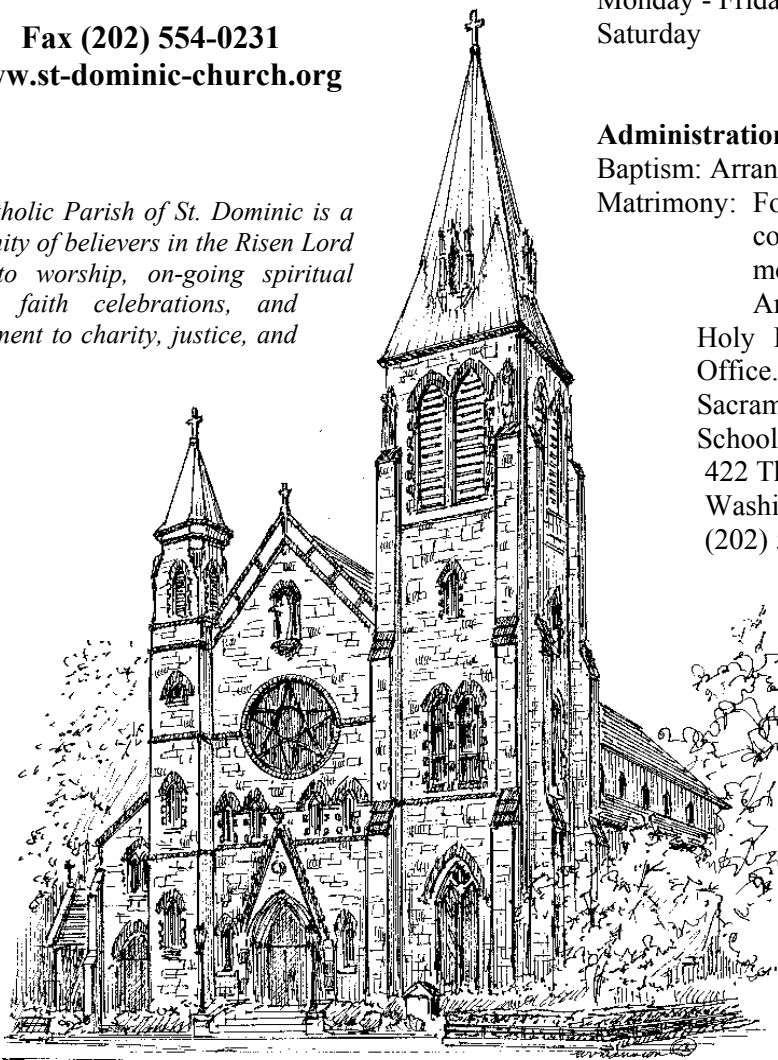

Pastor's Corner

This week we celebrate two Dominican feasts, Our Lady of the Rosary on October 7 and the memory of St. Louis Bertrand on October 9.

Our Lady of the Rosary was a feast that was instituted after the Battle of Lepanto when the Ottoman Turkish army was defeated by the army of western Europe. St. Pius V asked the faithful to pray the Rosary for their success. The Order has traditionally held that the rosary was the gift from the Blessed Mother to St. Dominic, as is seen in our statue at the shrine of the Most Holy Rosary. The story of this battle has been made famous by the poem *Lepanto* by G.K. Chesterton.

St. Louis Bertrand was a Spanish Dominican who was a missionary in South America. He defeated attempts to kill him: in one attempt, he was given poison to drink and after blessing it, serpents appeared in the cup; in a second attempt, someone was trying to shoot him. St. Louis again made a sign of the cross in blessing over the pistol and the barrel immediately turned into a crucifix. Our window for St. Louis Bertrand is the second window on the right when you enter the church from Sixth Street. St. Louis Bertrand is the patron of Masters of Students (seminarians) in the Order. St. Theresa of Avila sought his assistance when she was in the process of reformation of her order, Discalced Carmelites.

**Comunidad Hispana
Padre Eugenio Cahouet, O.P.**

**Veinte séptimo domingo
del Tiempo Ordinario
4 de octubre de 2009**

Estimada Comunidad Hispana:

Los capítulos 2 y 3 del libro de Génesis son una gran meditación sapiencial sobre el ser humano de **todos los tiempos**, tomado en sus tres relaciones fundamentales:

1), con Dios, con el universo material y con su semejante. El primer cuadro (primera lectura) presenta el proyecto de Dios sobre la humanidad y sobre la realidad entera; un proyecto todo tejido de armonía de luz.

2), En cambio el segundo cuadro (*La Caída en c. 3 no es leído hoy*) también traza el proyecto alternativo que el ser humano quiere realizar prescindiendo de la propuesta divina,

3) y cuyos resultados podemos percibir trágicamente en nuestra historia.

Estas páginas nos invitan a un examen de conciencia colectivo, para retornar a colaborar en el proyecto de Dios. En él, la relación del ser humano con su semejante, relación que es el fundamento de la sociedad, es descrito en su forma más alta: el amor del hombre por su mujer. La unicidad absoluta de la mujer, la complementariedad de los dos sexos y la relación de amor entre ellos son celebradas con el asombro eterno del hombre enamorado, en aquel primer canto de amor de la humanidad: "¡Esta vez es carne de mi carne y huesos de mis huesos!" (Gen 2, 23). Entre los establece una comunión tan profunda que los vuelva una única existencia, "una sola carne" (v. 24); unidad inquebrantable que "el amor es fuerte como la muerte" (Cant 8,6)

El *evangelio de Marcos*, tiene una coherencia interna, al presentarse como una especie de regla para la comunidad mesiánica, sobre los principales problemas de la vida cristiana. El primer tema es, precisamente, la enseñanza de Jesús sobre el matrimonio, en la que los versos centrales son vv. 6-9. El sacramento es una donación y entrega límpidamente totalizante, que no ser abolido dado por Cristo Sacerdote y Salvador (*Hebreos*) (Según C. Soltero, S.J. *Actualidad litúrgica* n. 210)
