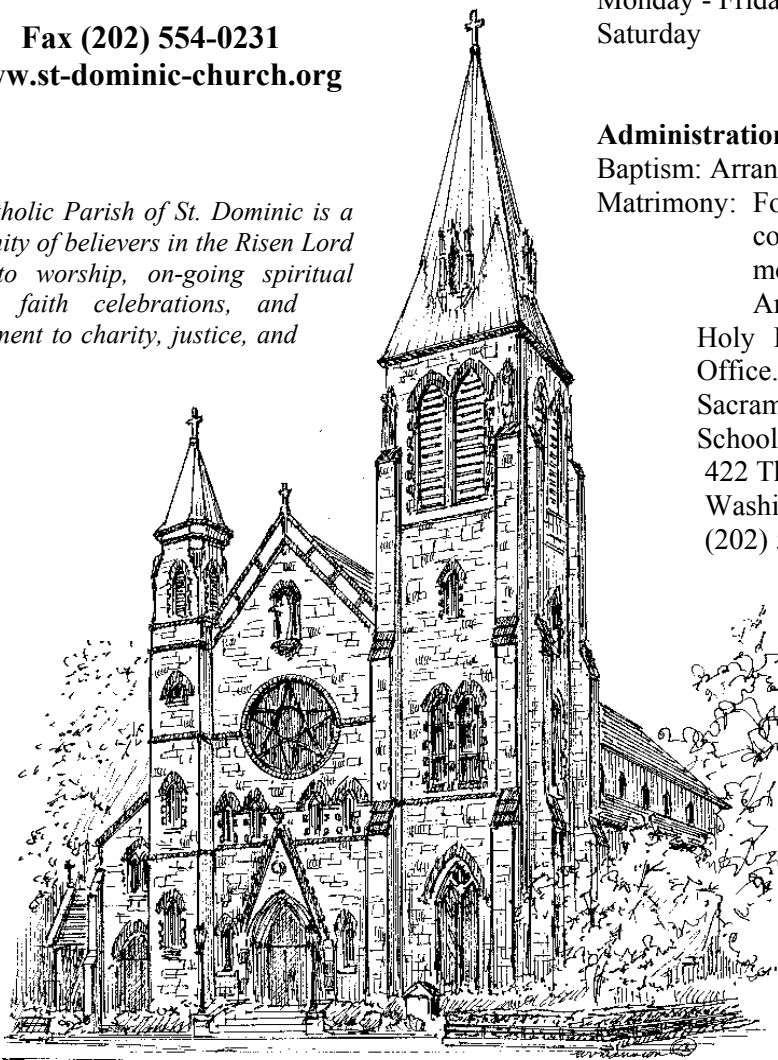

Our community's song is most often best expressed during the singing of the Mass Propers. Please open your Breaking Bread Book and sing:

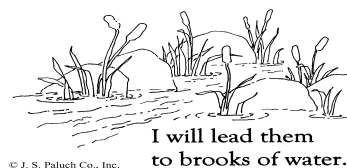

Liturgy notes for the 30th Sunday in Ordinary Time

As we approach the end of the liturgical year, the sense of urgency about Christ's return in glory increases in the readings of the liturgy. The feasts of All Saints, All Souls, and, soon, Our Lord Jesus Christ the King, help focus our minds and spirits on the end times. It is the season of the communion of saints. Día de los Muertos (Day of the Dead) is a Mexican tradition that sets time aside to pray for loved ones who have died. They fused an ancient Aztec celebration of honoring ancestors with the Christian ones that celebrate the communion of saints.

As well as being the 30th Sunday of Ordinary time in the Catholic Church, in many Protestant traditions today is known as Reformation Sunday. The "theme song" of the reformation, Martin Luther's "Ein Feste Burg" ("A mighty fortress is our God") is based on Psalm 46 and belongs to the group of psalms known as the Songs of Zion. Other translations of Psalm 46 include, "God is our refuge and our strength." Other verses include familiar texts such as "There is a river" and "Be still and know that I am God." The Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy says, "The treasures of the Bible are to be opened up more lavishly, so that a richer share in God's word may be provided for the faithful." Our scholars not only studied early and medieval church books in order to do this but worked with Protestant denominations as well. Pope Paul VI's ecumenical dream (that even though we have our differences, we might share the word of God) was realized in the 1969 Lectionary for Mass. Since then, this lectionary has become the basis for the order of readings for several Christian traditions. © 2009, OCP. All rights reserved.

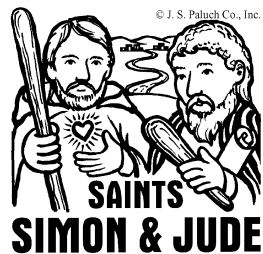

3. Where does the parish fit relative to the other ways that I spend my money?
4. How much do I give to the parish on a weekly basis? (If you give monthly or quarterly, calculate your weekly commitment to put it in perspective).
5. Is it too much, too little or just right?
6. If I am not at the parish for one or more Sundays, do I make up the amount that I have not given?
7. How much will I give each week during the coming year?
