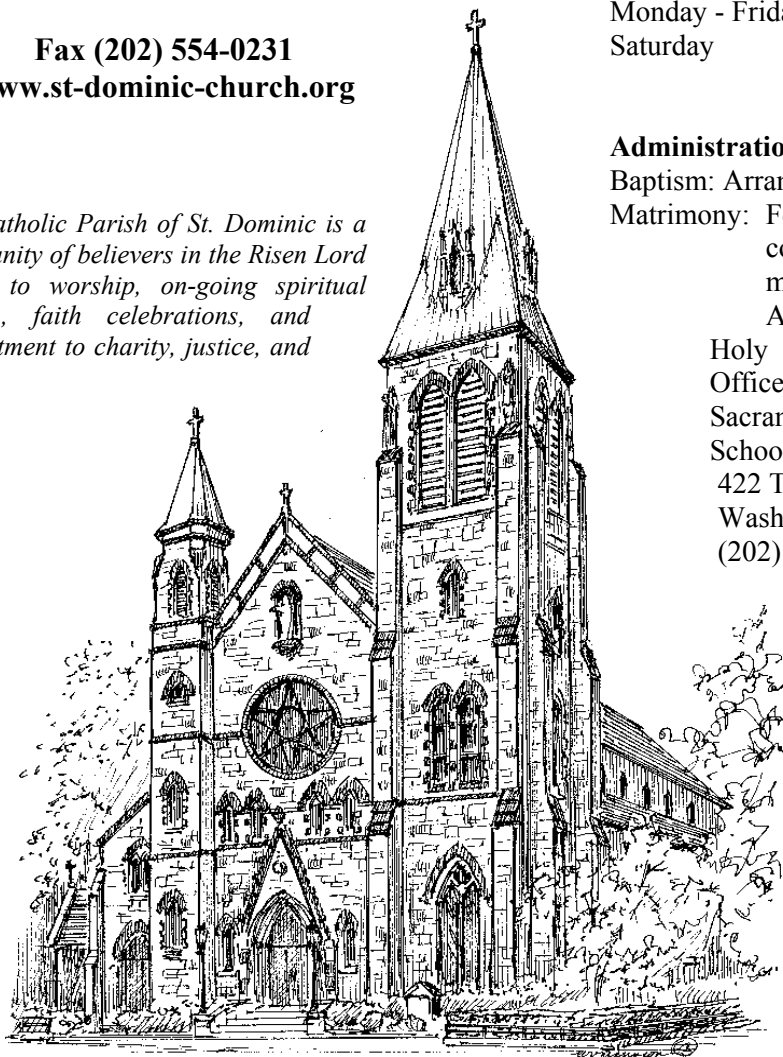

### The Liturgy of the 3rd Sunday of Ordinary Time

The Book of Nehemiah contains the story of the first Jews to return from the exile and to their resettlement of Jerusalem. This book documents the foundational community of Judaism. Today's reading details a liturgical celebration with the reading of the law of God to the community. In today's Gospel, we hear first from Luke's prologue (1:1-4), but then the reading skips to Jesus' first public sermon when he reads from the scroll in the synagogue and states the purpose of his mission by quoting from the Prophet Isaiah: to bring glad tidings to the poor, to proclaim liberty to captives, to give sight to the blind, and to free the oppressed.

There are parallels between these Scripture readings. Ezra proclaims from the Book of the Law; Jesus is the fulfillment of the Law and more.

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The law is written down; Luke lets Theophilus know he intends to "compile a narrative" of the story of Jesus for all. Ezra and Jesus both are returning home. Ezra's sermon is situated in Jerusalem to which he has returned; Jesus returned to Nazareth to begin his ministry which will take him to Jerusalem.

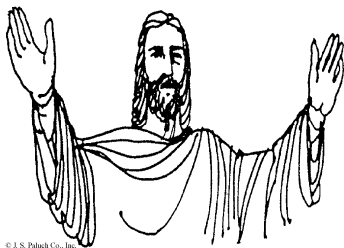

Estimada Comunidad Hispana:

Los Evangelistas no son meros compiladores de materiales pero son verdaderos autores de sus escritos. bajo el Espíritu Santo.

La primera parte del pasaje evangélico que hoy leemos es como una declaración de método, con la que el evangelista ilumina el trabajo que ha querido realizar; como una guía para la lectura del integro texto lucano,

Allí Lucas señal insistentemente la historicidad del acontecimiento “Cristo”. Se trata de “cosas que se han verificado entre nosotros”, que se pueden documentar mediante testimonios, que se pueden reconstruir por medio de investigaciones y búsquedas atentas, que se puede dispone en un contexto cronológico y geográfico definido.

Un testigo debe ser también un “servidor de la Palabra”. Historia y fe, Jesús y Cristo, hombre y Dios, no pueden separarse con una espiritualidad excesiva angélica o materialista. sino que servir la unidad de la encarnación.

La segunda parte es, en cambio, la página programática del mensaje de Jesús. Basándose en la perícopa que acaba de leer en la sinagoga de Nazaret, Jesús centra el significado de la misión que esta por iniciar: su menaje es un mensaje de salvación;

la nueva época que comienza con El es “un año de gracia del Señor”. Y de esta perspectiva brotan las opciones del programa: el Espíritu lo ha consagrado a favor de los pobres, de los prisioneros, de los ciegos, de los oprimidos....Ellos son los miembros privilegiado de la comunidad mesiánica. Con el “hoy” de Jesús “Esta Escritura que acaban de oír se ha cumplido hoy” se abre una nueva historia de salvación de liberación integral del ser humano. En evangelio de san Lucas Jesús misericordioso, amigo de los pobres y de los pecadores.

Pablo da la simbología del cuerpo de Cristo. Ella le permite incluir en su comunidad cristiana unidad y pluralidad. para efectuar la programa de Cristo en el mundo. La Iglesia es vivo, en que cada miembro es profundamente vinculado a la totalidad del cuerpo. Por eso, la Iglesia puede efectuar el programa de Cristo en el mundo.
