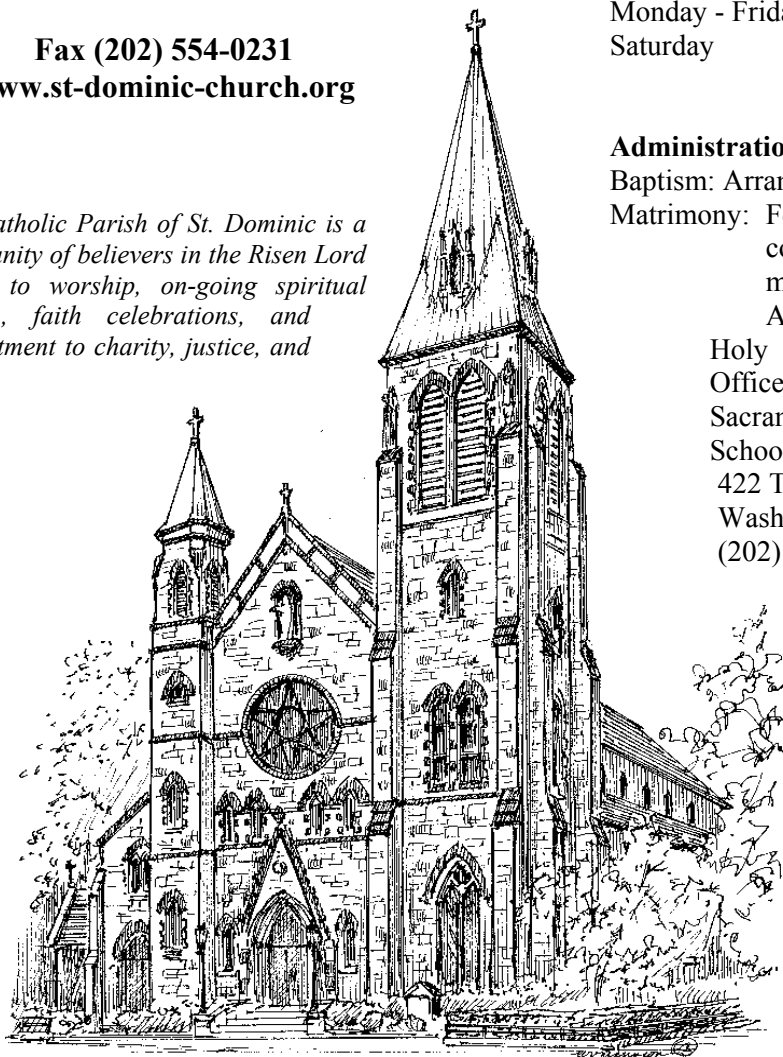

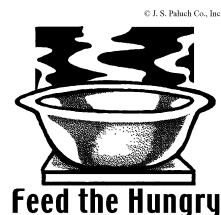
Please leave your donation for the Northwest Pregnancy Center in front of the altar for the blessing. We appreciate your generosity.

**Comunidad Hispana  
Padre Eugenio Cahouet, O.P.**

**Quinto Domingo  
del Tiempo Ordinario  
7 de febrero de 2010**

Estimada Comunidad Hispana:

vocación profética y apostólica es el tema de las lecturas clave de este domingo. El primer relato es autobiográfico y se debe a la mano de Isaías, el mayor los profetas “escritores” de Israel. Sirve como fondo al relato el templo y una celebración litúrgica: por una parte la Jerusalén terrena, sede de la presencia divina en el templo; por otra, la Jerusalén celestial, sede de la corte divina. Ambas aparecen unidas en una única visión.

La escena se abre con el himno cantado por los servidores de la corte celeste, los serafines; himno que tiene como contenido esencial la santidad absoluta de Dios. Se celebra así la trascendencia y la perfección incontaminada de Dios, simbolizada también por el “humo” que lleno el santuario.

Isaías se da cuenta de la impureza de su humanidad ante la santidad y la grandeza de la esfera celeste que se le ha mostrado; pero su reacción espontánea hace que la gracia divina intervenga. Dios pide un voluntario sin condiciones y Isaías dice “Aquí estoy yo, envíame”. Se encuentra los dos protagonistas de la vocación: Dios, que abre el diálogo y el hombre que acepta con entusiasmo.

En el relato paralelo del evangelio se pueden distinguir cuatro breves escenas. Primero: A un lado Jesús; al otro, el muchedumbre cansado y desanimado. Segundo: Los personajes Jesús y Simón en su primero contacto. Tercero: Crece la intimidad de Jesús, sus seguidores en su trabajo aparentemente infructuoso, pero Pedro experimenta éxito grande con sus pescados. Cuarto: Dejar-Seguir. Al fin: El resultado es la comisión de Jesús “Desde ahora serás pescador de hombres”.

San Pablo es un testigo de la resurrección de Cristo. Como la sepultura fue el sello de una Encarnación que hizo al Hijo de Dios semejante en todo a nosotros, las “apariciones” del Resucitado son la señal de su divinidad, que se manifiesta a los creyentes en aquellas experiencias pascuales.

El Señor que se nos hace presente en la Eucaristía nos llama también **a nosotros a ser portadores** de su mensaje de salvación.
