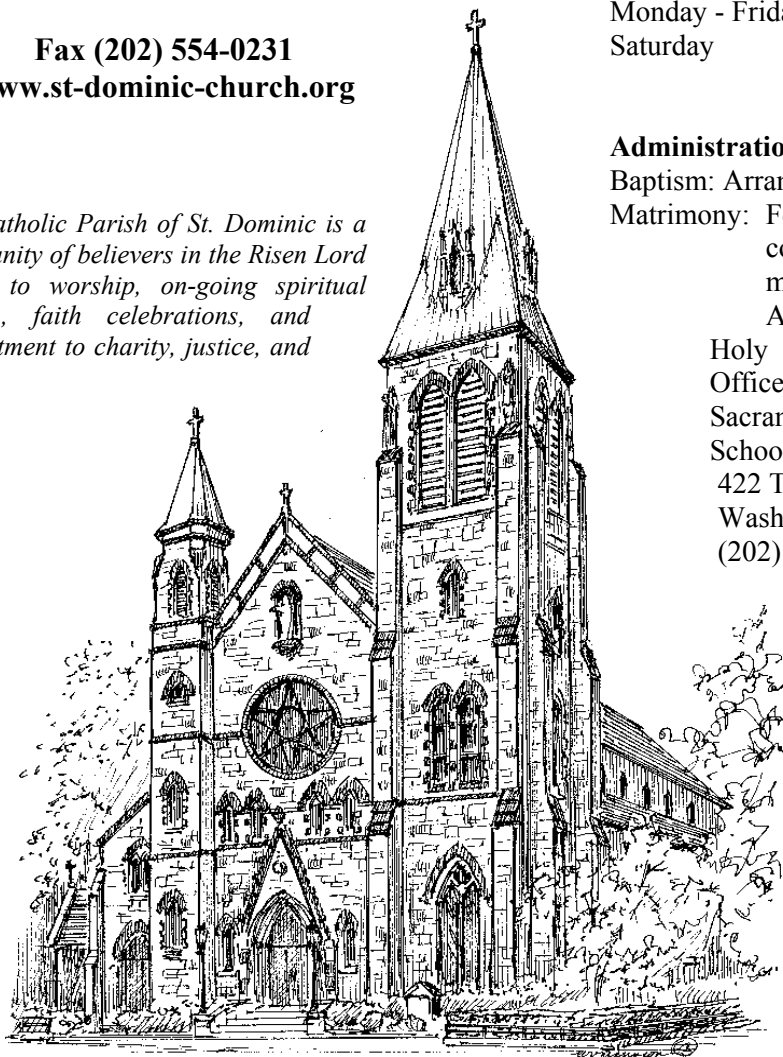

Pastor's Corner

This year, Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, February 17 and ends at the Evening Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday, April 1. The brochures for the Lent/Easter season will be available at all the church entrances on the weekend of February 13/14 and will be available online at the same time. Because of the major repairs that are taking place in the priory, some of the activities that we have had in the past will not be held this year.

The times of Masses on Ash Wednesday are: 7:45 a.m. , 11:30 a.m. , 12:20 p.m., and 5:15 p.m. Ashes will only be provided at Masses.

As you may have noticed over the past few weekends, we are very limited in the number of Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion, Lectors, and Acolytes. I am sure that I do not need to remind you of the importance of the Sunday Liturgy in the life of a faith community and the demands that proper celebration makes on our ministers. Please consider sharing your gifts with the community here while you are at Mass in one or more of these ministries. On Saturday, February 13, the Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion will be having their training. If you are willing to serve in this ministry, please come to this training in the church at 10 a.m..

As an act of Lenten preparation for the mysteries and glories of Easter, perhaps NOW is the right time for you to volunteer your service as a Liturgical Minister.

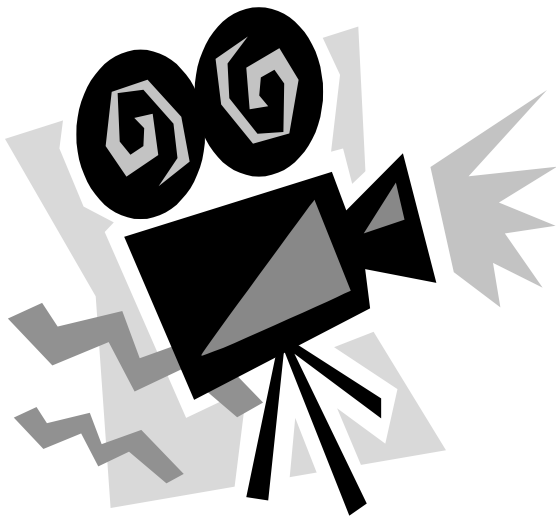

Comunidad Hispana Padre Eugenio Cahouet, O.P.

**Sexto Domingo
del Tiempo Ordinario
14 de febrero de 2010**

Estimada Comunidad Hispana:

La bendición-maldición de la primera lectura, presentada en estilo sapiencial aunque está tomada de la profecía de Jeremías, es como un anticipo literario y teológico para la proclamación de las bienaventuranzas de San Lucas en el evangelio.

Jeremías, con un paralelismo perfecto, presenta la actitud fundamental y radical del creyente y del no-creyente: *Maldito el hombre que confía en el hombre... bendito el hombre que confía en el Señor*” Jr. (7, 17) La palabra central es la palabra de la fe: “confiar”; es decir, poner la propia estabilidad, el fundamento de la propia existencia. Por eso las opciones fundamentales son dos: la autosuficiencia idolátrica y la adhesión gozosa a la propuesta divina. Y los resultados de esas dos opciones están vivamente ilustrados con la doble imagen vegetal: símbolo de la vida, de fruto, de frescura, para el creyente; de muerte, de aridez y de amargura para el pecador.

Las bienaventuranzas de Lucas llaman la atención por su brevedad (son solo cuatro, ocho por Mateo); brevedad que esta compensada por los cuatro “¡Ay de ustedes!” paralelos, que no se encuentran en mateo. Llamam también la atención por su redacción en segunda persona de plural, lanzada directamente a los oyentes, por el acento social que tienen las bienaventuranzas mismas. Si esos “ustedes” se encuentran ahora en situación de pobreza, de hambre, de llanto y de persecución, la bienaventuranza de Jesús es para ellos.

La bienaventuranza central, que ayuda a comprender también las otras, es la de la pobreza. Ella evoca sin duda, la categoría vetérotestamentaria de los “pobre de Yahveh” de la que dan testimonio los canticos de María y su *Magnificat*, de Zacarías y su *Benedictus* y de Simeón y su *Benedictus*.

Pablo dice en *I Corintios* de la primacía de la Resurrección de Cristo. El es nuestra “primicia”. Es el primer ser humano, que quiere compartir su vida gloriosa con ¡NOSOTROS POBRES! después su Crucifixión.

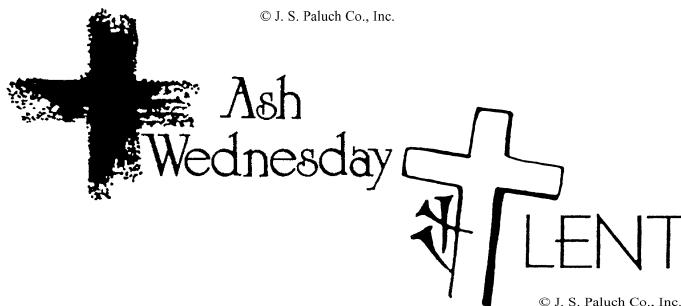
