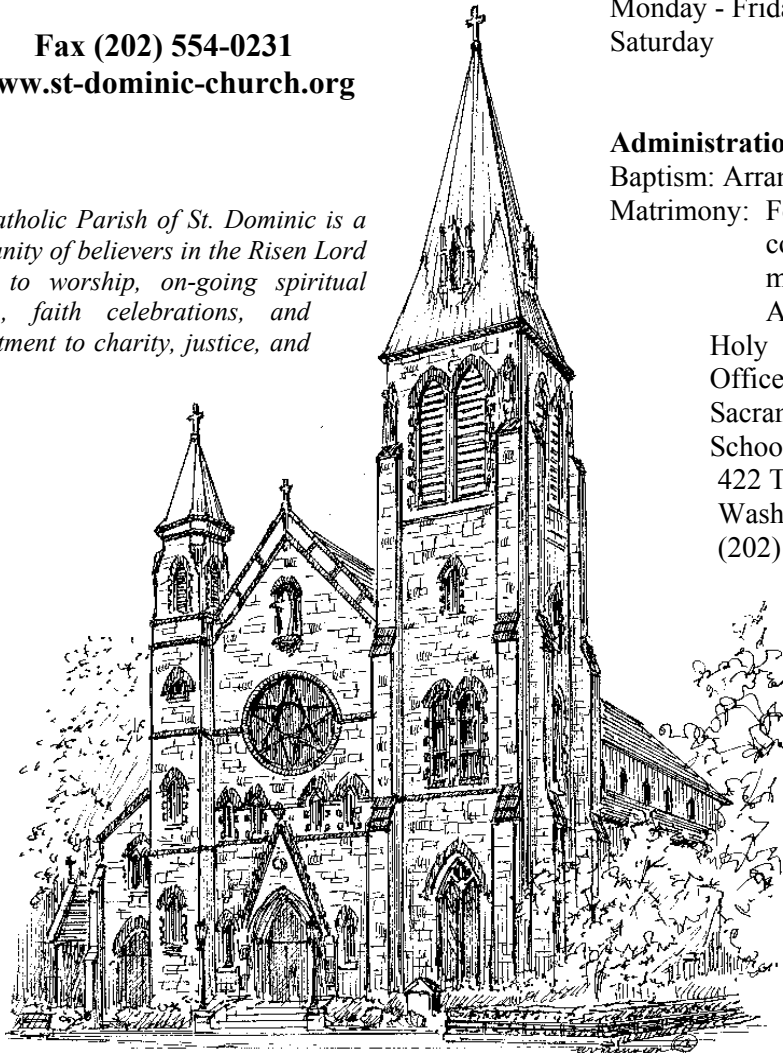

Pastor's Corner

This weekend, our RCIA catechumens will be presented to and received by Archbishop Wuerl at the Rite of Election at the Basilica of the Immaculate Conception on Sunday, February 21 at 3 p.m.. From that point on, they will be referred to as our Elect and will begin the formal Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults and participate in the rites at the Lenten liturgies.

Our Elect received their garments at the Mass of Sending Forth on Saturday, February 4 and when they are with us at the Liturgy, they will be wearing them in our presence. When they are not present at the liturgy, their garments will be on the altar rail to remind us of their presence in our community and to call forth prayers from all of us here at St. Dominic's in support of their journey of faith that will take them to the Initiation Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist at the Great Vigil of Easter. Please remember our Elect whenever you offer prayer during this holy season of Lent.

As you will note in the Lent/Easter brochure, in addition to the usual times for the Sacrament of Reconciliation, during Lent the Sacrament will be available on Wednesday evening from 6:30 p.m. - 8:00 p.m. in the church. These dates are February 24, March 3, 10, 17, 24, and 31.

Out of solemn respect for the liturgy and courtesy for everyone, please silence/turn off all electronic devices and cell phones when you arrive in the church. In keeping with tradition, gentlemen are asked to please remove their hats while in the church.

Sung Mass Propers and Psalms for Lent: Our community's understanding of the ritual elements of the liturgy is often best expressed during the singing of the Mass Propers. For the season of Lent, we will sing the Mass setting included in the insert stapled to the front cover of the Breaking Bread Book (pages 2-3 of the insert—the Trinity Mass for Lent). As is our custom, we all sing the Kyrie, Gospel Acclamation, Sanctus, Memorial Acclamation. Great Amen and the Lamb of God. Many of the Psalms for Lent are also included in the insert pages 4-5). Many know this music "by heart." Publishing the words and notes helps our visitors (and sometimes our own memory) so all can sing and pray.

As an act of Lenten preparation for the mysteries and glories of Easter, perhaps NOW is the right time for you to volunteer your service as a Liturgical Minister.

We are actively recruiting volunteers to serve as ushers, acolytes, lectors, Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion, and Music Ministers. We need the assistance of four ushers, one to three acolytes, two lectors, three EMHC, and music ministers (a minimum of 12 lay ministers at each Mass are need to efficiently serve the community, so we are always in need of volunteers. Our parish sponsors formal and informal training for each liturgical ministry on a regular basis.

- Our parish **ushers** are informally organized and frequently our experienced ushers recruit volunteers immediately before Mass (to assist with the gathering of the collection/gifts, etc.). Parish Traditions: Inclusion of the Liturgy of Evening Prayer during the season of Lent: Our heritage as a Dominican parish sculpts many of our parish activities and celebrations. As part of that heritage, we follow the Dominican Lenten custom of incorporating the Liturgy of the Hours into the appropriate parish Masses. The Saturday 5:15 p.m. and Sunday 5:15 p.m. Masses will incorporate Evening Prayer. The Liturgy of Evening Prayer, consisting of psalms, will take the place of the Penitential Rite of the Mass. After communion, Mary's Hymn, the *Magnificat*, will be sung. On Palm Sunday the blessing and distribution of palms takes the place of the Penitential Rite at all Masses.

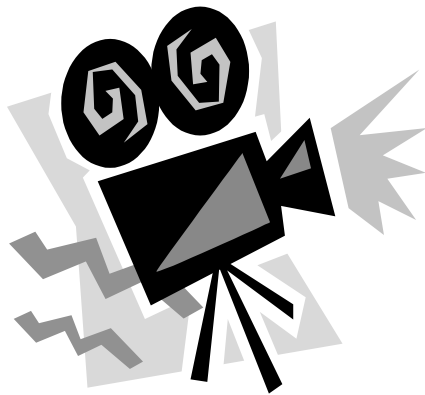

**Comunidad Hispana
Padre Eugenio Cahouet, O.P.**

**Primero Domingo
de Cuaresma
21 de febrero de 2010**

Estimada Comunidad Hispana:

La liturgia de la Palabra de este domingo se presenta como un gran introducción al periodo mas importante del ano litúrgico: la preparación al gran misterio de la Pascua y a su celebración. El hilo conductor que da unidad a la selección de textos de la Sagrada Escritura que hoy leemos parece ser la profesión de fe en Dios y en Jesucristo.

De hecho la primera lectura ofrece un texto tomado del libro del Deuteronomio, que es considerado una antigua profesión de fe de Israel. Esta profesión de fe, ambientada en el contexto litúrgico de la fiesta de las primicias, la ofrenda de los primeros frutos de la tierra, insiste en tres artículos de la fe de Israel: el llamado divino a los patriarcas; **el don de la libertad**, después de la amarga experiencia en Egipto; el don de la tierra “fluye leche y miel”.

Aparece aquí una característica fundamental de *la fe Israelita*: ella es, *por excelencia histórica*. Dios no es una ideología abstracta: es una presencia encarnada en la trama pesada y muchas veces frágil de las situaciones humanas. la historia es el lugar de la Palabra de Dios y de la Revelación, y la respuesta del hombre debe ser también histórica y existencial.

Nuestra segunda lectura, formada de la carta de San Pablo es un ejemplo espléndido del “credo paulino”, aunque se advierte ahí una matriz antigua, que se remonta a los orígenes mismos de del cristianismo: “Jesús es el Señor y “Dios lo resucitó de entre los muertos”. Con esta fórmula Pablo quiere subrayar especialmente la continuidad entre el Jesús-hombre terreno y el Cristo-Dios resucitado. Es abierto a todos judíos y no-judíos.

Por Lucas el vértice de la tentación es en Jerusalén. Allí es, de hecho, donde se tendrá la última prueba de la mesianidad de Jesús. Allí acepta El su destino último: la salvación a través **de la pobreza extrema de la cruz**. Dé ese modo, Jesús es el modelo luminoso de la adhesión plena y total a Dios.

La Cuaresma se abre con fuerte llamada a redescubrir la pureza de fe. Caminémonos fortalecidos con la Palabra y Eucarística. (Según C. Soltero *A l n.* 212)
