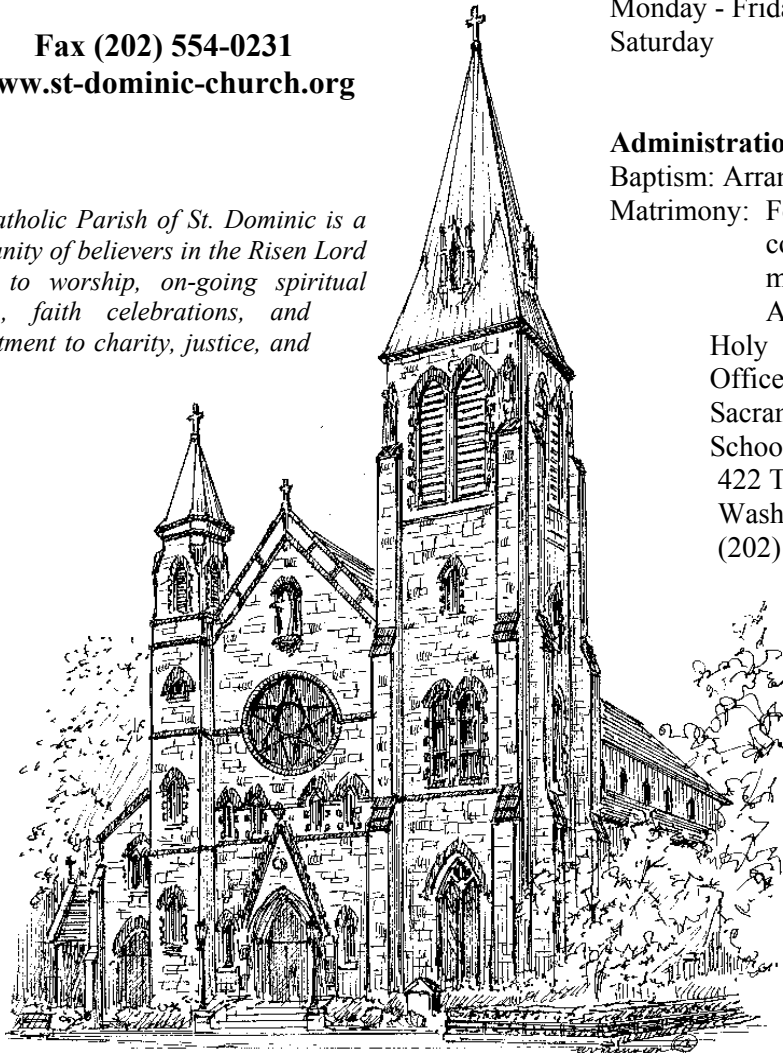

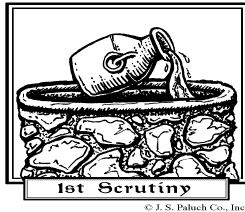

Pastor's Corner

With this weekend, the RCIA process begins with the final liturgical preparations for our Elect on their faith journey to the Great Vigil of Easter. This weekend we celebrate the 1st Scrutiny at the 8 AM Mass. Please continue to remember our Elect during this time and, when they are with you at the liturgy (next weekend at the Sunday 5:15 PM and March 21 at the Sunday 10:45 AM Masses), stop by to welcome them before you leave Mass.

This month we have two days that take precedence over the Lenten weekday Masses. On Friday, March 19 we celebrate the Solemnity of St. Joseph, Spouse of the Blessed Virgin Mary and on Thursday, March 25 we celebrate the Solemnity of the Annunciation of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Please note that the rules for the Lenten fast or abstinence are not abrogated on those days.

If you would like to make a donation for the Easter flowers, please use the envelopes that are found in the pews. When making a donation for the flowers in memory of loved ones, please indicate clearly the name(s) of those for whom the donation is made and whether they are living (L) or deceased (D). In addition, if you would like to make a donation toward the Easter Candle, please contact me.

Out of solemn respect for the liturgy and courtesy for everyone, please silence/turn off all electronic devices and cell phones when you arrive in the church. In keeping with tradition, gentlemen are asked to please remove their hats while in the church.

Sung Mass Propers and Psalms for Lent: Our community's understanding of the ritual elements of the liturgy is often best expressed during the singing of the Mass Propers. For the season of Lent, we will sing the Mass setting included in the insert stapled to the front cover of the Breaking Bread Book (pages 2-3 of the insert—the Trinity Mass for Lent). As is our custom, we all sing the Kyrie, Gospel Acclamation, Sanctus, Memorial Acclamation. Great Amen and the Lamb of God.

Many of the Psalms for Lent are also included in the insert pages 4-5). Many know this music "by heart." Publishing the words and notes helps our visitors (and sometimes our own memory) so all can sing and pray.

As an act of devotion in preparation for the mysteries and glories of Easter, this is the right time for you to volunteer your service as a Liturgical Minister.

We are actively recruiting volunteers to serve as ushers, acolytes, lectors, Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion, and Music Ministers. We are always in need of volunteers.

Parish Traditions: Inclusion of the Liturgy of Evening Prayer during the season of Lent: As part of our heritage as a Dominican parish, we follow the Order's Lenten custom of incorporating the Liturgy of the Hours into the Saturday 5:15 PM and Sunday 5:15 PM Masses. The Liturgy of Evening Prayer, consisting of Psalms will take the place of the Penitential Rite of the Mass. After communion, Mary's Hymn, the *Magnificat*, will be sung. On Palm Sunday the blessing and distribution of Palms takes the place of the Penitential Rite at all Masses.

Traditions and customs of the Season of Lent Lent (What are the "Scrutinies?")

Two weeks ago we celebrated the rite of election with our RCIA candidates (referred to as "the elect" in these weeks of Lent leading up to their baptism, confirmation, and Eucharist at the Easter Vigil).

On the Third, Fourth, and Fifth Sundays of Lent, rites known as scrutinies are celebrated with the elect following the homily at Mass. The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) explains that the scrutinies "are rites for self-searching and repentance...meant to uncover, then heal, all that is weak, defective, or sinful in the hearts of the elect; to bring out, then strengthen, all that is upright, strong, and good." As a community, we join in prayer for the discernment of the elect.

The Year A Gospels for the Third, Fourth, and Fifth Sundays of Lent provide the fundamental imagery for the scrutinies, so the Year A readings are used whenever the scrutinies are celebrated. Special prayers found in the Sacramentary are used for the Third, Fourth, and Fifth Sundays of Lent when the scrutinies are celebrated.

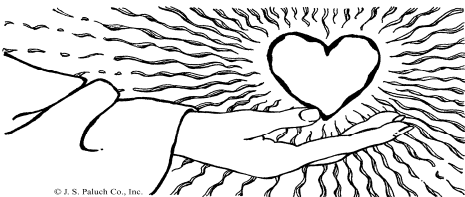

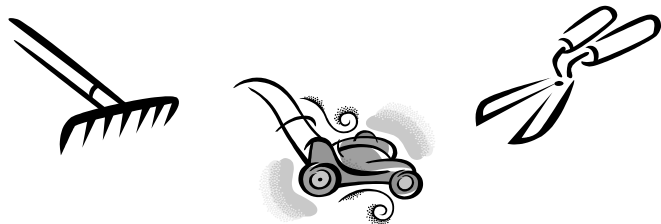
Please leave your donations for the Northwest Pregnancy Center in front of the altar for the blessing. We appreciate your generosity.

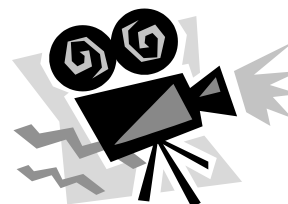

Estimada Comunidad Hispana:

En el evangelio hoy La exigencia de una respuesta a la invitación de Dios y su Palabra se vuelve radical y urgente con Jesús, Palabra definitiva del Padre. Lucas lo subraya en el evangelio con unos hechos de crónica y una palabra. Presenta primero dos episodios de crónica “negra” de aquella época en Jerusalén: una represión brutal del ejército romano dentro del templo, y lo sucedido a dieciocho personas que murieron al derrumbarse la torre de Siloé. Jesús no se alinea con quienes quieren ver en una desgracia del dedo justiciero de Dios. Esos muertos no eran ni mas pecadores ni mas culpables que otros. Por eso Jesús dice a sus oyentes que deben ver en lo sucedido una invitación a “convertirse”.

Viene luego la parábola de la higuera improductiva, con el dialogo entre

el dueño (el Padre) de la vina

y el viñador (Jesús) se establece un dialogo de intercesión por

la humanidad indiferente y árida (la higuera).

– Tenemos siempre ante el Padre un mediador que intenta restaurar los hilos de un dialogo que el ser humano ignora o quiere interrumpir. Jesús suplica al Padre espera todavía para que en este árbol que es la humanidad florezca y fructifique una respuesta de amor y de justicia.

En la misa oremos hoy “Que esta Eucaristía, Señor, nos obtenga **a quienes imploramos tu perdón**, la gracia de **saber perdonar a nuestros hermanos**”.

Y también la poscomunión, que habla de la importancia de la Eucaristía y de los sacramentos y de su fruto en nuestra vida: Alimentados, “ya desde esta vida con el pan del cielo, **prenda de nuestra salvación**, concédenos, Señor manifestar en todos nuestros actos el misterio de tu Eucaristía”. Si tengamos la Eucaristía debemos perdonar ellos que nos han ofendidos.

La Cuaresma es un tiempo en que la Iglesia nos invita a la conversión. Que nuestra participación en la Eucaristía nos ayude a ser más dóciles a la invitaciones del Señor y a **dar el fruto que espera de nosotros**.
